A Heartfelt Note on the Absence of Salif Keita

One of the most anticipated moments of the festival was the scheduled appearance of Salif Keita, "the Golden Voice of Africa." His non-appearance was a profound disappointment felt by fans, artists, and the festival team alike. As shared in his video message, Salif is facing a serious health condition and was unable to travel. His wellbeing remains the top priority.

Festival organizers extend their sincere gratitude to the audience for their compassion and understanding during this unexpected and emotional moment.

We are deeply thankful to **Hawa Kasse Mady Diabaté**, **Madou Kouyaté**, and Salif Keita's "daughters" **Aicha Mariko** and **Fatoumata Soubeiga**, who stepped in with grace to honour Salif's voice and legacy. Together with the Salif Keita Electric Band, they delivered a once-in-a-lifetime performance that carried Salif's spirit across the grounds of Mnazi Mmoja, touching hearts and uniting the festival community through music.

Statement from Salif Keita's Management

"Dear all. First of all thank you to Sauti Za Busara Festival for an amazing work bringing beautiful music from the African continent and bringing people together for magic musical days. We prepared Salif Keita's performance in Zanzibar for almost a year, and he was looking so much forward to visit his beloved island.

Sadly he got ill last week and had to go to hospital. We kept the hopes that the doctors would let him travel, until last minute. Unfortunately in the end, he was not allowed to travel as it could worsen his condition.

He asked his 'daughters' Aicha Mariko and Fatoumata Soubeiga, to sing his songs with 'his children', the rest of Salif Keita electric band. We invited the legendary griot singer, Hawa Kasse Mady Diabate, to sing three songs from her multi awarded album 'Toumaro', released last year on One World Records, together with the virtuoso Ngoni bass player, Madou Kouyate, and to join Salif Keita's band performance, presenting a historical show, with music that could reach all the way to Bamako, to heal our legend.

We are more than grateful for the amazing reception from the audience and for the understanding of why Salif could not be here this moment. Salif Keita is sending his warmest greetings and he thanked God that Hawa Kasse Mady Diabate could replace him.

Thank you to all of you for accepting the surprise production we managed in a short time. Thank you to everyone who called us from around the world to wish Salif Keita a speedy recovery.
